A Presentation of Your Community's Survey Data

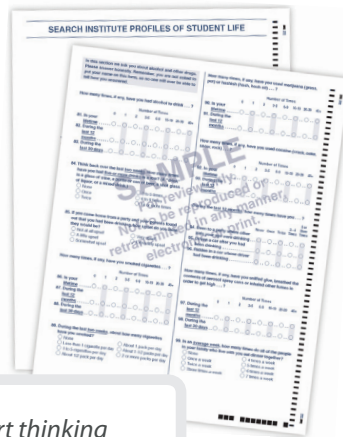
This presentation builds a shared understanding of young people's strengths and needs in the participant's community, based on findings from the Search Institute survey *Profiles of Student Life: Attitudes and Behaviors* or *Me and My World*. The presenter will provide and suggest possible interpretation of the survey data and point toward concrete actions the community can use to help build on its strengths.

Key content:

- Understand the concept of Developmental Assets®.
- Understand participants' survey results and implications for their community.
- Apply the survey results to their own experiences and perceptions.
- Accept the challenge of sharing the survey results and their implications for asset building with other members of the community.
